## COVID-19 VACCINATION AND QUARANTINE

The CDC recently released updated [guidance](#) on quarantine for individuals following vaccination for COVID-19.

Vaccinated persons with an exposure to someone with confirmed COVID-19 are not required to quarantine if they meet all of the following criteria:

- Are fully vaccinated (i.e., ≥2 weeks following receipt of the second COVID-19 vaccine dose)
- Are within three months following receipt of the second COVID-19 vaccine dose
- Have remained asymptomatic since the current COVID-19 exposure

In addition, vaccinated persons who meet the above criteria are not required to quarantine following international travel.

Vaccinated individuals are still encouraged to get tested for COVID-19 following international travel or an exposure to someone with confirmed COVID-19.

Persons who do not meet all three of the above criteria should contact Occupational Health Services (OHS) for guidance following international travel or an exposure to someone with COVID-19. The OHS COVID-19 call center can be reached at (734) 764-8021 and is available 7 a.m. to 5 p.m., seven days a week.

## VISITOR POLICY FOR RADIOLOGY AND LAB/BLOOD DRAW STATIONS

Please be reminded that radiology and lab/blood draw stations have limited space, and therefore no visitors will be allowed for adult patients unless their cognitive/physical impairments require assistance. Pediatric patients may be accompanied by one primary caregiver.

## REMOTE WORKING EXTENDED THROUGH JUNE 2021

Michigan Medicine will extend remote working guidelines for all those employees capable of working from home through the end of June 2021. Minimizing traffic to our campus and facilities will help keep our patients, visitors and workforce safe and decrease the spread of COVID-19.

## INSTRUMENT PRODUCT CHANGES

The Central Sterile Processing Department is continuing the phased conversion of re-useable, Supply Chain distributed instruments to commercially sterilized, single-use instruments. **The list of instruments affected is outlined in the attached document.**

All necessary changes to support continued ordering/use are being transitioned, as well.

**Implementation Timeline:**

- Beginning the week of February 22, 2021, phased implementation is occurring in all locations throughout Michigan Medicine, and will be completed by February 26<sup>th</sup>.
- No action is needed to be taken by the end-user department. Legacy product will be replenished with new product as inventory is depleted.

**\*\*Your current practice of returning used instrumentation will remain UNCHANGED.**

**FURTHER UPDATES BEING MADE TO ResponsiBLUE APP**

The ResponsiBLUE app is once again being updated and will soon include an additional question in the daily symptom tracking questionnaire, a number of usability improvements based on feedback from the community, and a quarantine and isolation indicator for students.

To further align with guidance from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, all users will be asked an additional question related to international travel. The question, “Have you returned from international travel in the past 10 days?” will take the daily questionnaire from three to four questions.

The changes were scheduled to take effect at 10 a.m. today, Feb. 22.
