FEB. 19 TOWN HALL Q&A

Q1: Local public schools are staying virtual due to U-M COVID-19 cases and a lack of vaccine access for teachers. Please describe how Michigan Medicine is assisting its local community to vaccinate teachers and mitigate real or perceived risk due to being proximate to the campus.

Q2: Is there any effort by Michigan Medicine to collaborate with Ann Arbor Public Schools to help distribute vaccines to teachers as part of Phase 1B so schools can go back to at least partial in-person and improve the mental health and productivity of many employees?

A: Michigan Medicine is supporting the Washtenaw County Health Department in vaccinating local school employees against COVID-19. On Saturday, Feb. 27, a clinic at Michigan Stadium — along with others at two IHA locations — aims to vaccinate approximately 1,200 elementary school educators. The health department is providing the vaccine out of this week’s allocations from the state, and is working directly with local schools and districts to connect their staff to the appropriate partner for registration. The Michigan Medicine COVID-19 Vaccine & Therapeutics Taskforce will continue to partner proactively with and engage requests from county health departments to support their vaccination efforts, while also administering the vaccine allocation we receive directly from the state to eligible Michigan Medicine patients and health care workers, in alignment with state [guidelines](#).

UH ROOM CLOSURE – IMPORTANT EMERGENCY RESPONSE CORRECTION

We want to clarify emergency response processes during the UH room shutdown that has relocated adult patients to be cared for on Mott 11W (C&W). There is no change from typical code team or RRT response to adult patients in C&W: the pediatric code teams will serve as the first responding team and hand off to adult code teams on their arrival.
