### **MASKS REQUIRED FOR VISITORS AT ALL TIMES**

COVID-19 cases are once again increasing in Michigan. The percent positivity for the state has gone from as low as 3% in February to up to 12% recently. Rising rates in the community put our hospitalized patients at risk.

In order to continue to allow limited visitation for our patients, Michigan Medicine requires that all visitors wear a mask that covers their nose and mouth when in the facility. **This includes in a patient room.** This is critical to reducing the risk of exposure to COVID-19.

Visitors who are not fully compliant will not be permitted to visit. Masks are required regardless of vaccination status.

To continue to permit limited visitation for our patients, visitor mask compliance is imperative. A flyer has been created that can be handed to visitors in your areas. It is attached to this email and printed copies will be hand delivered to certain areas, as well.

Additionally, patients who are medically able to tolerate one should wear a mask whenever a visitor is in their room. With a visitor and patient both wearing masks, this will guarantee interactions remain as safe as possible.

### **LAST DAY: VITAL VOICES 2021 FACULTY AND STAFF ENGAGEMENT SURVEY**

The Vital Voices 2021 Faculty and Staff Engagement Survey will close at the end of the day today. As of this morning, more than 64% of staff and 61% of faculty have participated in the survey, and we want to hear more! To log in to either survey, employees will need a unique password, which is the last eight-digit employee ID (UMID) and last two digits of their birth year. (Example: UMID is 12345678 and birth year is 1979, password will be 1234567879.)

### **SOCIAL DISTANCING, MASKING REMAINS IMPERATIVE**

It is imperative to continue to comply with mask and social distancing requirements, both at work and in other public settings, even if you are fully vaccinated. While the vaccine is very efficacious, there have been a small number of fully-vaccinated individuals becoming infected. In addition, our population is a mix of vaccinated and unvaccinated individuals, so continuing to follow all prevention guidance is important to keep everyone safe.

### **REMINDER: COVID-19 TESTING FOR PATIENTS WITH PRIOR INFECTION**

Patients who tested positive for COVID-19 and have recovered should not be retested for 90 days after their positive test unless they develop new concerning symptoms. This includes pre-admission and pre-procedure testing.
