## DAILY COVID-19 PATIENT STATS

Today's census for COVID-19 inpatients and those patients under investigation (PUI) are noted below:

### RESTRICTED VISITOR POLICIES TAKE EFFECT TODAY

Due to rising COVID-19 cases across Michigan — including a rise in the number of hospitalizations — a restricted visitor policy goes back into effect at Michigan Medicine today, April 2. Visitors are only allowed for adult patients when medically necessary.

This change is being made to minimize the risk of the spread of COVID-19 to our patients and staff.

Two parents/caregivers are permitted for pediatric inpatients (patients under 21 years of age) and this will remain the same.

Family and visitors are required to wear their mask (covering their mouth and nose) at Michigan Medicine at all times — even if they have received a COVID-19 vaccine. This includes while they are in a patient room and throughout the facility. Those that are not compliant will not be permitted to stay. Patients who can tolerate a mask must wear one when a health care worker or visitor is present in their room. Patients in the Emergency Department must wear a mask at all times.

In ambulatory care clinics, no visitors will be allowed for adult patients unless the patient has a cognitive or physical impairment that requires assistance. One primary caregiver is allowed to accompany each pediatric patient (patients under 21 years of age) to an appointment, unless an additional aide or assistant is required. There is no change to the current visitor policy for ambulatory surgery and procedural areas.

### PLAN AHEAD: ROAD CLOSURES RELATED TO CONSTRUCTION OF NEW HOSPITAL

Please be advised that a series of intermittent lane closures are scheduled to be put in place along East Ann, Observatory and Zina Pitcher beginning in early April and lasting through June. The closures are related to utility work associated with construction of the new hospital on campus.

The closures will also affect transit routes.
