MICHIGAN MEDICINE COVID-19 VACCINATION TIME

We continue to encourage department managers and supervisors to be creative and flexible to accommodate their staff taking time to get vaccinated either onsite or through a community site. We understand this will vary from unit to unit due to patient care and staffing needs, and in some cases employees will need to schedule their vaccination before or after their shift or during a break, but given the importance of vaccination for the safety of our entire community we request managers remain flexible during this unprecedented time.

As Michigan Medicine’s vaccine supply continues to limit our ability to open enough first dose appointments to serve all of our eligible population, for those who have not received invitations for appointments, **we strongly encourage you to [explore additional opportunities to be vaccinated through a variety of local options, as soon as you can.](#)** At this time, we continue to serve all eligible Phase 1A, 1B, and are sending batches of invitations out to our 1C population. We look forward to serving all adults in Phase 2 soon but need more vaccine supply to open up appointments. We’ll continue to send weekly updates as we learn our supply allocation.

Michigan Medicine employees are not included in recent announcements from President Schlissel regarding release time for vaccinations. This only applies to Ann Arbor, Dearborn and Flint campus employees.
