#### **EMPLOYEE COVID-19 VACCINATION OPPORTUNITIES TODAY**

**Ford Auditorium:** There is a walk-in COVID-19 vaccination clinic today, April 23, at Ford Auditorium on the main medical campus. Employees interested in being vaccinated can walk in until noon. If you are interested, please work with your supervisor to make arrangements as applicable, if during work hours.

Moderna vaccine will be used, so plan on returning for a second dose in four weeks. A medical record number (MRN) is not needed for the Ford Auditorium clinic. Employees vaccinated at this clinic will need to watch for second dose clinic opportunities and locations, which are TBD at this time. Please note that this is a walk-in clinic and there is the potential for long lines. Please plan accordingly. Social distancing requirements remain in effect.

**Michigan Stadium:** Also today, April 23, there will be a walk-in vaccination clinic held at Michigan Stadium for patients and employees from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. **A medical record number (MRN) is required** for this clinic.

#### **N95 RESPIRATOR UPDATE**

The process for fit testing the Halyard duckbill style mask continues as this is intended to be the primary N95 at Michigan Medicine. Please be sure to get fit tested as soon as you are invited.

The supply for the standard, white 3M N95 Respirator (size small only) will be depleted in the next couple of weeks. The substitute for this mask is the surgical, teal N95 Respirator. We have plenty of supply of the teal N95 respirator and are not at risk for running out.

As a reminder, because both masks are made by the same manufacturer, passing the fit-test on either mask means that the employee can safely wear either mask. The flyer that includes this fit-testing guidance can be found

#### **COVID-19 COLLEAGUE CONNECT SUPPORT LINE**

The COVID-19 Colleague Connect clinical care support line is available from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., seven days a week. Colleague Connect is staffed with critical care intensivists, nurses and pharmacists who are ready to respond to questions from teams caring for COVID-19 patients at hospitals and health systems across the state. The goal of the support line is to improve care for critically-ill COVID-19 patients, wherever they are receiving care.

### **MANAGING VITT FROM THE J&J COVID-19 VACCINE**

The COVID-19 Vaccine and Therapeutics Task Force (CVTT) Safety & Efficacy Group has finalized guidelines for the diagnosis and management of Vaccine-Induced Thrombotic Thrombocytopenia (VITT) from the J&J/Janssen vaccine. VITT is an extremely rare side effect seen in some recipients of the J&J COVID-19 vaccine. ### **GET HELP PROCESSING THE IMPACT OF THE VERDICT IN THE DEREK CHAUVIN TRIAL**

The news coverage of the Derek Chauvin trial for the murder of George Floyd has been a painful reminder of racialized trauma, both witnessed and lived experiences.

In response to the announcement of the trial verdict on April 20, Organizational Learning, OHEI and ODEI are collaborating to offer safe spaces — Community Listening Circles — for the U-M community to come together to process the impact following the trial verdict. These Community Listening Circles will allow us to hold space for the range of emotions many of us feel from disbelief to outrage and the anxiety around the outcome of the trial. The flow of dialogue centers advocacy, comfort in safety and non-judgment, and intentionally creates a container for self-expression and the development of peer understanding and empathy.
