MASKING GUIDELINES TO REMAIN THE SAME AT MICHIGAN MEDICINE

The CDC has recently issued guidance that fully vaccinated individuals can stop masking. This guidance does not apply to the health care setting, so [masking guidelines](#) will remain the same at Michigan Medicine. We will continue to evaluate the implications of updates in the health care setting and, in consideration with Michigan Department of Health and Human Services guidance, will update accordingly.

COVID-19 is decreasing, but continues to circulate in Michigan. It is most protective to continue to mask in indoor public settings unless everyone is vaccinated. In addition, those with compromised immune systems should continue to mask, regardless of their vaccine status and discuss with their medical provider.

Of the more than 2,000 COVID-19 hospital admissions at Michigan Medicine since March, less than 1% had been fully vaccinated. The vaccine is extremely effective and preventing COVID-19 infections as well as COVID-19 related hospitalizations/severe disease.

EMPLOYEE COVID-19 VACCINATIONS AT OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH SERVICES

Employees who received their first Moderna COVID-19 vaccine dose at Ford Auditorium the week of April 20-23 will be due for the second Moderna dose the week of May 18-21.

Occupational Health Services (OHS) will have staff and Moderna vaccine available for these employees to receive their second dose May 18-21 from 7 a.m.-4 p.m. on a walk-in basis. Employees must bring their vaccination card reflecting receipt of their first dose and must arrive no later than 4 p.m. to accommodate the 15-30-minute observation period following vaccination. If you require a second Moderna dose, please work with your supervisor to make arrangements to visit OHS to complete the vaccination process.

OHS continues to offer both first and second dose Pfizer vaccinations Monday – Friday from 7 a.m.-4 p.m. Please note that this is a walk-in clinic and there is the potential for long lines. Please plan accordingly. Social distancing requirements remain in effect.

COVID-19 VACCINES NOW AVAILABLE FOR YOUNGER INDIVIDUALS

Michigan Medicine has opened scheduling for COVID-19 vaccine appointments for individuals as young as 12 years old. Appointments are available starting today, May 14, to patients age 12-15 who have Michigan Medicine medical record numbers (MRN). All appointments are still available for anyone over age 15 who has not yet been vaccinated.

The U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) has expanded the emergency use authorization (EUA) for the Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine to include this younger population. Previously, the Pfizer vaccine was only available to patients age 16 and older.

The FDA and Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) have extensively reviewed the available research and determined that the Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine is safe and effective at preventing serious illness caused by the coronavirus in individuals as young as age 12.

Vaccines are offered by appointment only. You do not have to be a Michigan Medicine patient to schedule an appointment, but you do need an established Michigan Medicine medical record number (MRN). Call 734-936-4990 to set up an MRN before calling to schedule an appointment.

If the adolescent has a [MyUofMHealth](#) patient portal account, the patient or an adult with proxy access for the patient can easily schedule an appointment online. Individuals without portal access can call 734-763-6336 to schedule by phone.

If a parent or guardian will not be accompanying a patient under age 18 to their appointment, written permission must be provided. Only one parent or guardian is permitted per child with an appointment. Visit our [COVID-19 Vaccines for Adolescents & Children webpage](#) for more information.

MICHIGAN MEDICINE CLOSING MICHIGAN STADIUM VACCINATION SITE, TRANSITIONING TO OTHER LOCATIONS

May 21 will be the last day to get a first dose administration of the COVID-19 vaccine at Michigan Stadium. Michigan Medicine's central vaccine operation is transitioning to Ambulatory Care operations and University Health Service operations beginning May 24. Occupational Health Services is already providing vaccines directly to Michigan Medicine faculty, staff and learners on a walk-in basis.

If you have not yet received your first dose of the vaccine and want to get it at the Big House, use your [MyUofMHealth.org](#) portal account or contact the call center at 734-763-6336 to make an appointment, while still available. If you received your first dose at the stadium and are due for your second dose, you will be able to schedule an appointment for your second dose at the stadium through June 11. After that time, you will have to receive your second dose of the Pfizer vaccine as a walk-in patient at the OHS clinic, or by using the portal to schedule an appointment NCRC.

Brighton Health Center will transition to a patient vaccination site on May 26, administering doses of the Moderna vaccine. That same day, the North Campus Research Complex (NCRC) will open as a vaccination site by appointment only, administering doses of the Pfizer vaccine. Northville Health Center will also soon begin administering the Moderna vaccine to registered Michigan Medicine patients. As of May 27, University Health Service will begin offering vaccination appointments two days per week to UHS students. Students should self-schedule through their [MyUofMHealth.org](#) portal accounts.
