## DAILY COVID-19 PATIENT STATS

Today's census for COVID-19 inpatients and those patients under investigation (PUI) are noted below:

Symptomatic testing: 11.78 %

Asymptomatic testing: 1.91%

**Discharges:** 2,472 total COVID-19 discharges to date, 16 in the last 24 hours. These numbers include patients discharged to skilled nursing facilities but excludes deaths and discharges to hospice.

**Deaths and hospice:** Since March 10, 2020 Michigan Medicine hospitals have had 253 total deaths or discharges to hospice, 0 in the last 24 hours.

#### EMPLOYEE WALK-IN VACCINE CLINICS

Occupational Health Services (OHS) will be offering employee walk-in COVID-19 vaccinations (Pfizer vaccine) beginning Thursday April 29<sup>th</sup> from 7 a.m. – 4 p.m. Employees interested must arrive no later

than 4 p.m. to accommodate the 15- to 30-minute observation period following vaccination. Please work with your supervisor to make arrangements as applicable, if you plan to be vaccinated during work hours. Employees vaccinated at OHS will be responsible for returning to OHS for their second dose three weeks after receiving the first dose, or as soon as possible after. Employee IDs will be required to receive vaccinations, but a medical record number (MRN) is not necessary. Please note that this is a walk-in clinic and there is the potential for long lines so plan accordingly. Social distancing requirements remain in effect inside the clinic.
