DAILY COVID-19 PATIENT STATS

Today's census for COVID-19 inpatients and those patients under investigation (PUI) are noted below:

ROAD WORK RELATED TO NEW HOSPITAL CONSTRUCTION

Please be advised that the next phase in the construction work related to the new hospital is underway. The project will cause East Ann Street, between Observatory Street and Zina Pitcher Place, to be closed for utility work.

Plan ahead and expect delays and alert patients if they will be traveling in the area. Here's what you need to know:

- Eastbound East Ann traffic will be detoured south on Glen, east on East Huron Street, south on Washtenaw, east on Geddes and north on Observatory back to East Ann.
- Westbound East Ann traffic will be detoured south on Observatory, west on Geddes, north on Washtenaw and north on Zina Pitcher Place back to East Ann.
- Subsequent project-related road closures in June/July, and their associated detours within the same vicinity, will be posted in the field.

WEEKLY TESTING REQUIREMENT FOR U-M STUDENTS

U-M students currently enrolled in classes are required to undergo weekly COVID-19 testing. Workforce members who are also students must comply with weekly testing in order to access all university buildings.

Compliance with weekly testing is monitored with the ResponsiBLUE app. Additional information about the weekly testing requirement for students can be found [here](#).

Beginning in the spring/summer term (effective May 4), students who are fully vaccinated will be exempt from the weekly testing requirement. In order to receive an exemption, proof of vaccination must be submitted through [Wolverine Access](#). Students may also submit exemption requests for other reasons through Wolverine Access.
