OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH SERVICES COVID-19 VACCINATION HOURS OF OPERATION

OHS continues to offer first and second dose Pfizer COVID-19 vaccinations on a walk-in basis.

Effective Monday, May 24, the Employee COVID-19 Vaccination Walk-in Clinic at OHS will be available according to the following hours of operation: Monday, 7 a.m. – 1 p.m.; Tuesday, 7 a.m. – 1 p.m.; Wednesday, 10 a.m. – 4 p.m.; Thursday, 7 a.m. – 1 p.m.; and Friday, 10 a.m. – 4 p.m.

Please keep in mind that these hours only apply to the employee COVID-19 vaccination walk-in clinic and do not impact normal OHS hours of operation.

Those receiving their first dose at OHS will be responsible for returning to OHS for their second Pfizer dose three weeks after receiving the first dose or as soon as possible thereafter. Your employee ID will be needed, however, a medical record number (MRN) is not required. Employees returning to OHS for their second Pfizer dose must bring their COVID-19 vaccination card confirming receipt of their first dose. Please note that this is a walk-in clinic and there is the potential for long lines. Please plan accordingly. Social distancing requirements remain in effect.

N95 RESPIRATOR FIT TESTING

Occupational Health Services has been working with leadership across the organization to prioritize areas of high N95 respirator use to be fit tested to the Halyard duckbill style respirator. Employees required to be fit tested will receive an email invitation with instructions on how and where they can go to be fit tested.

If you have received an invitation to be fit tested for the Halyard respirator, please do not delay in scheduling an appointment or attend a walk-in clinic as soon as possible. OHS continues to offer fit testing in the hospital dining room and at the OHS Med Inn location, and will soon be offering fit testing at various ambulatory care sites. If you have received an invitation to be fit tested, please make sure to follow the instructions in the email you received to ensure timely compliance with this important initiative.

BLUE QUEUE QUESTIONNAIRE AND EMAIL SERVICE CLOSING TODAY

All U-M personnel who have completed the Blue Queue questionnaire and indicated an interest in receiving the COVID-19 vaccine have now been invited to schedule an appointment or have received the

vaccine elsewhere. Recognizing that some individuals in Blue Queue who indicated wanting the vaccine may have chosen to defer — or may have had other barriers to getting scheduled — information was provided this week directly to those BQ members about opportunities that will continue to be made available to help them get vaccinated.

Michigan Medicine is now transitioning the process for all faculty, staff and learners to receive a COVID-19 vaccine. It is no longer necessary to complete the Blue Queue questionnaire or to update it after getting the vaccine.

If you want to get the vaccine and you are a Michigan Medicine employee, contractor or temporary staff member, Occupational Health Services (OHS) will be offering walk-in COVID-19 vaccinations at the OHS Clinic. Please read the “OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH SERVICES COVID-19 VACCINATION HOURS OF OPERATION” section of this email to see hours of operation.
