COVID-19 VACCINATIONS FOR CHILDREN AGES 5-11

U-M Health will begin offering vaccination to children ages 5-11 at COVID-19 vaccination clinics beginning Monday, Nov. 8. Scheduling for the COVID-19 vaccine appointments for children ages 5-11 will begin today, Nov. 5.

COVID-19 vaccination will be offered at vaccination clinics at the Brighton Health Center, Northville Health Center and North Campus Research Complex (Building 200) in Ann Arbor. Appointments are required and the location of your appointment will be noted when you are scheduling your appointment.

Mott will also have a vaccination site for patients who are already at the hospital for appointments. Clinics can send eligible patients (ages 5-11) to the second-floor vaccine clinic near the family center to receive a vaccine.

INFLUENZA NOW CIRCULATING IN COMMUNITY: GET IMMUNIZED AS SOON AS POSSIBLE

Influenza is now circulating in the local community, especially among the college age population. There have been 17 cases in the last week, with most being between 18-21 years old. Don't forget to get your flu vaccine as soon as possible. It takes about two weeks to mount a full immune response. Our COVID-19 prevention measures are also protective against influenza exposure. Please continue to mask unless in a private office or eating physically distanced from others and wear eye protection for all patient-facing activities. MICHIGAN MEDICINE OUTLOOK ACCOUNTS TO BE UPGRADED

Between now and mid-December, Health Information Technology & Services (HITS) will upgrade approximately 48,000 Michigan Medicine Outlook accounts from onsite servers to the cloud.

This upgrade marks the next major step in making the full Microsoft 365 (M365) experience available to everyone across Michigan Medicine, and is necessary to support better integration with other Microsoft tools (including SharePoint Online, Office 365 + OneDrive, and Forms), and to enable full functionality when Microsoft Teams and Planner are introduced (coming soon!).
